Information

Provision of Temporary Continuous/Remote Learning

If the application for temporary permission is approved, how will the district or accredited nonpublic school ensure that all students with IEPs are provided with FAPE during the time the district/school is providing services primarily online?

Non public students with IEPs are served through Davenport Community School District. Davenport Community Schools has provided those students with Chromebook and times for live instruction provided through them.

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If the application for temporary permission is approved, how will the district or accredited nonpublic school

ensure that students who require mental health or health services still have access to these services during the time the district/school is providing services primarily online?

Our school guidance counselor will provide support to families and students during this time based on need by individual families.

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If the application for temporary permission is approved, how will the district or accredited nonpublic school ensure that students with 504 plans continue to receive services?

Teachers are aware of 504 plans for each student in their class. The guidance counselor will also reach out to teachers and students to make sure their needs are being met for the students. We will also have other teachers that will help provide support to classroom teachers and students such as our intervention teachers.

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If the application for temporary permission is approved, how will the district continue to provide meals to students?

Our food service will continue to provide meals for students to pick up. Students will be able to call/text in orders for meals and pick up breakfast and lunch at the same time. Information about this will go out to families.

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If the application for temporary permission is approved, how will the district provide access to instructional materials and services for students who do not have access to the internet?

Students will take home all workbooks. Teachers will reach out to students by phone for those families that do not have internet. We will find out which families need internet devices and will be able to provide families with at least one device per family and possible more depending on the need.

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If the application for temporary permission is approved, what process will you use to communicate with parents/families on educational services and changes in delivery models?

We will let parents know as soon as possible that we will start this plan next week so that they can plan for supervision for their children. That is why we will finish this week and meet with teachers to plan online instruction time for their students starting on 11/23. We will send out emails to families about our change in delivery of instruction. We will also use our school messenger system to call all families. It will be posted on Facebook and our school website.
