Dates to Remember

- April 15 VRF and SRI test sites open
 - May 11 VRF and SRI test sites close
 - May 15 VRF, SRI, and AA open for production
 - June 20 SRI Certification Deadline
 - June 21 AA Certification of Subgroups, Participation and PAY (Partial Academic Year) – this application is for public districts only
- VRF = Vertical Reporting Framework
 - SRI = Student Reporting in Iowa
 - AA = Assessment Accountability (formerly AYP)

Diploma

- SRI -> ENROLLMENT - Diploma
- Diploma = '1' Yes
 - Student has a signed diploma at time of submission
 - Districts may have more than one set of board approved graduation requirements / credits that result in the student receiving a District Diploma. An example of this may be a Basic Diploma or an Honors Diploma.
 - Special Education student **MUST** be staffed out of IEP in order to be reported as a Graduate (Diploma = '1')
 - Enter Staffed Out Date
 - No new EP record is needed
 - Do not change the IEP level

Diploma, cont.

- Students marked with Diploma = '1' will also need:
 - Post-graduation Location
 - Post-graduation Plan
 - Extracurricular Activities
 - Paying Job

Diploma, cont.

- Diploma = '0' No
 - Student finished his/her education and will not be returning in the fall but did not receive a signed diploma
 - Student may have received a certificate of attendance or participation
 - Most foreign exchange students
 - These students are not considered graduates

Diploma, cont.

- Diploma = '99' Not Applicable
 - Students who will be returning in the fall
 - IEP students who will be continuing in the fall to meet IEP goals
 - Students who are expected to meet graduation requirements during the summer
 - Students who finish requirements during the summer must be marked as a graduate in the *Graduate Verification* application in August

Attendance

- SRI -> ENROLLMENT – Attendance Rate
 - Attendance Rate by building
 - Maximum Days Enrolled
- Attendance data from SRI is used in the *Iowa School Performance Profiles* application

Attendance, cont.

- Expected for all actively enrolled PK – 12 students
 - Including...
 - CPI students dual enrolled
 - CPI HSAP students
 - SWVPP students (on-site and off-site)
 - Students in a 4+ Transition program
- Do not count absent students who are
 - In a Detention Center or Youth Shelter
 - Homebound
- FTE is important for attendance calculations

Chronic Absenteeism

- SRI -> ENROLLMENT – Chronic Absenteeism
- Students absent 10% or more
- Attendance data from SRI is used for Chronic Absenteeism in the *Iowa School Performance Profiles* application

Foster Care

- SRI -> PROGRAMS/INDICATORS – Foster Care
- Subgroup for ESSA reporting
- Regular Ed foster care students roll into *Reg. Ed Foster Care Claim* application
 - SRI-> PRE-POPULATED – Regular Ed Foster Care Claim

Reason No State Assessment (RNSA)

- SRI -> PROGRAMS/INDICATORS – Reason No State Assessment
- Students with an Entry Code of '1', '2', '3', '4', '5', '10', '15', or '19' enrolled during district testing expected to have scores
 - If not, required to have RNSA
- DLM is a state assessment - these students do not need RNSA if student completed all required testlets

Removals

- SRI -> REMOVALS
- SRI requires information on all
 - In-School Suspensions
 - Out-of-School Suspensions
 - Expulsions
 - Interim Settings
- Removal data from SRI is used in the *Iowa School Performance Profiles* application

First Enrollment Date in US School

- **Needed for**
 - **Immigrants**
 - **ELL Students who entered your district 07/01/2018 or more recent**
 - **Used for ESSA accountability – we need to know which ELL students are attending their first year of US schools**

Potential Dropouts

- **SRI -> PRE-POPULATED -> Potential Dropouts**
- **Preview using Fall and Winter SRI data**

9-12 Students with No Courses

- SRI -> COURSES – Students with No Courses
- Students expected to have courses:
 - Regularly enrolled students with no Service Type or Service Provider
 - Entry Code = 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 10, 11, 15, 19, or 81
 - Part-time enrolled students
 - Entry Code = 8, 16, 18, or 82
 - CPI Dual Enrolled for academics
 - Entry Code = 6, 9, 12, 14, 27, 29
 - With CPI Dual Enrollment = 1 or 3

Non-Fall Supplementary Weighting

- Make sure Section FTEs are populated for all ...
 - Eligible Concurrent Enrollment courses that started after 10/01/2018
 - Courses marked in Secondary CTE Reporting Application as being used to meet offer and teach are ineligible for SW. (FTE = 0.000)
 - Courses in which you have students with Entry Code '16' (public shared time)
 - ICN courses

Non-Fall Supplementary Weighting, cont.

- SRI -> CE/SW
- Several different reports to view – will only show students reported by your district
- Data from Spring SRI used to populate *Supplementary Weighting (Non-Fall)* application

Reminder

- Level II Errors in Spring (SRI) include, but are not limited to...
 - High School with no Grads
 - Potential enrollment errors – different value reported in Spring with no new enrollment
 - Missing RNSA
 - Student reported in Winter and not in Spring

District Contacts

- Review District Contacts in SRI and make any necessary changes
- Email lists are generated using these contacts
- When we have a question, who is the first person we should contact? Usually not the same person in all categories
- May be updated at any time
- May enter two people by using a ‘;’ between names and email addresses

Assessment Accountability

- Data from Spring SRI rolls into Assessment Accountability
- Separate application – Portal > EdInfo > Assessment Accountability
- Used to verify
 - Subgroups
 - Participation
 - Partial Academic Year status (PAY)
- Zoom session May 20th @1:30
 - Check DE calendar for link
- Must be certified separately – June 21st

Supplementary Weighting – (Non Fall) Application

- Found in DE Portal > EdInfo > Student Level Applications > Supplementary Weighting (Non Fall)
- Courses with Section FTE > 0.000
 - Students for whom your district generates funding
 - Does not include students for whom you bill another district.
- All courses should have a weighting factor
 - If blank for a concurrent enrollment course, check CCN
- Certification deadline: August 24th

Graduate Verification

- Found in DE Portal > EdInfo > Student Level Applications > Graduate Verification
- All districts and nonpublic buildings housing grades 9-12
- Certification deadline: August 24th

Fall 2019 Data Elements

- No new data elements impacting student registration forms.
- 2019-2020 Data Dictionary will be posted to the SRI website this summer.
