

RULES

All of these rules must be followed. No exceptions.



AWARDS*

1st place - \$1000 will be awarded to the high school attended by the creators of the winning video.

2nd place - \$600 will be awarded to the high school attended by the creators of the second place video.

3rd place - \$400 will be awarded to the high school attended by the creators of the third place video.

**The awards and contest are sponsored by Electronic Engineering.*

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Teams are students in grades 9-12. One entry per school attendance center (high school.) School districts with multiple high schools may submit one per school.
- Each team will create a 90 second or less video based on the theme "What's Your Plan". All entries must reflect this theme.
- Inappropriate content is portrayal of anything illegal for use by minors or in violation of local board policy.
- Cannot use copyrighted or trademarked material.

VIDEO REQUIREMENTS

- Reference the Iowa School Safety Alliance (ISSA), #IASchoolsafety
- Include ISSA's logo and website iowaschoolsafety.org and **Electronic Engineering** (Sponsor)
- Include the theme "What's Your Plan?".
- The theme should focus on the mission of the ISSA with emphasis on mitigation. The mission is to *Assist schools in preparing for, mitigating, responding to and recovering from natural and man-made threats and incidents.*
- Sample topics would include: Identify risks and potential emergency and tell how you are prepared; what actions does your school take to address emergencies; how are you prepared; types of drills your school does.
- Some topic examples are:
 - Reporting threats and other illegal activities
 - Community/student watch activities
 - How students can help keep school facilities safe
 - How students should be prepared for an emergency at school
 - How a student's attitude impacts safety and how can that be changed for the better
- The video must be the work of students with only minimal guidance from a teacher and then only for technical assistance or guidance on the appropriateness of the message.
- The video must only use or recommend high impact, low cost topics or suggestions. Topics should be easily transferable to and implemented in any school building in Iowa.
- While you may identify participating students in the credits, do not use real names or identify students by other than a false name in the actual video. When posting, the credits will likely be erased unless further consent is obtained beyond the one necessary for the actual submission of the video.
- Do not use copyrighted material, such as, but not limited to ALICE or ALERT. All content must be original work. No violations of copyright or trademark law accepted.

Marketing

- Students may promote their video using social or other types of media. Those using social media should document the usage and submit it as part of the entry. Your entry needs to outline how you promoted it, and if you received local recognition.
- Students should develop a marketing plan to be submitted with the entry.

VIDEO SUBMISSION

JUDGING CRITERIA

Judging will be based upon the following criteria:

- Communication of the theme – how well the entry expresses the theme “What’s Your Plan” #IASchoolsafety
- Creativity – how innovative and artistic the entry is
- Production – how well the entry is directed, written, edited and finished
- Marketing – how well the entry is presented to fellow students, parents, the community

About the Contest

This is a video contest, sponsored by the Iowa School Safety Alliance. It is for Iowa high school students, grades 9-12. In a creative way, this competition provides an opportunity for students to learn the importance of school safety issues and, particularly, the role of students in ensuring their facilities are safe.

The Iowa School Safety Alliance (ISSA) was established in 2012. Participating organizations include the Iowa Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Management, Iowa Department of Education, Iowa State Education Association, Iowa Association of School Boards, School Administrators of Iowa, American Institute of Architects – Iowa Chapter, Iowa Pupil Transportation Association, School Safety Managers, School Resource Officer and at-large members.

The mission of the ISSA is to

Assist schools in preparing for, mitigating, responding to and recovering from natural and man-made threats and incidents.

We want to ensure students, staff and visitors are safe inside of school facilities or on school grounds should a natural or man-made disaster impact the school. Our focus is to educate educators, architects, emergency management, contractors, law enforcement, first responders and many others on how best to design and protect school facilities with the ultimate goals of minimizing the impact on students and others.
